BE READY FOR A FAVORABLE WIND

There is an old Chinese sailing proverb that goes like this, "Be ready for favorable wind." It is echoed in other cultures in various ways, but the gist is this, when your opportunity arises, take advantage of it – whether sailing or not. When the wind blows your direction, set your sails and glide to your destination.

Why bring this up? Because the winds have changed in our congregation's financial picture, and today we have an opportunity to take advantage of it.

The finance committee has worked hard the last several years to keep a balanced budget and because of your help, Good Shepherd is currently sitting in a financially stable position. We have an operational cash reserve, and are meeting our monthly budget commitments. As a result, today, we have the ability to do some hard work together to pay off our remaining loan.


The congregation currently owes about \$1.8 million towards our building mortgage. At current payment levels, we have about 22-25 years left to pay, depending on interest rates. That said, the winds have changed so that we stand in a good position to make extra payments towards the mortgage and pay it off early. In fact, the Finance Committee has set a goal to be "DEBT FREE BY 2030".

How?

The School rental is providing income that has already begun making early payments on our behalf. If we raise an additional \$10,300 a month towards early payments, we will have it paid off by 2030. Paying off our mortgage by 2030 will save the congregation over \$700,000 in future interest payments. That would be \$700,000 that we could use for the ministry of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, instead of paying it to the bank.

\$10,300 seems like a lot. And yet, in November last year, Pastor Poppe laid the groundwork for this push by leading a Bible study on debt and stewardship. Since that time, we have already received over \$55,000 in extra payments towards our debt. That's almost half of what we would need per year to pay our debt off by 2030 donated in only 3 months! Add to this some thriftiness in the budget and the financial winds have changed so much that **we can accomplish** the goal of paying

our debt off early.



And if we fall short? We still win. Every dollar we pay towards our mortgage this year eliminates around a dollar of interest over the life of the loan.

We are not going to do an expensive "capital campaign" or knock down your door asking for money. What we are going to do is keep you apprised of our progress in the News and Notes. We will keep a running tally (in a yet to be determined way) somewhere in the Narthex. We will try to give you updates at Council Meetings, Voter Meetings, and a yearly update by letter. By God's grace, and by steady efforts, we can eliminate the mortgage debt of our congregation, and begin to serve ourselves and our community.

The scriptures don't talk much about wind and ships, but they do talk about debt. "The rich rules over the poor, and the borrower is the slave of the lender." (Proverbs 22:7) Let's stop being a slave to our debt. The winds have become favorable, and are pushing us that direction. Let's shift the sails to ride the wind and become a debt free congregation.
