THE HOLY SPIRIT AS ADVOCATE

One of the most important biblical sources on the person and work of the Holy Spirit can be found in the Gospel of John, in what is known as the "farewell narrative" (John 13: 1-17: 26). This instruction of Jesus to His disciples on the evening before His death contains some of the most memorable and beloved texts in all of Scripture: "I am the way, the truth, and the life" (John 14: 6); "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you" (John 14: 27); "I am the vine; you are the branches," (John 15: 5); "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you" (John 15: 12); "Take heart; I have overcome the world" (John 16: 33). It is also punctuated with Christ's teaching about the Holy Spirit — the *Paraclete*.

What is a 'Paraclete'? There are times when translating a word from the Greek New Testament into English proves so difficult that scholars choose simply to transliterate the word instead. This is often the case with the Greek word *Paraclete* (paráklētos), an important title for the Holy Spirit in the farewell narrative.

When it is translated, *Paraclete* is usually rendered as "Helper" (ESV), "Comforter" (KJV), or "Counselor" (RSV). None of these options, however, adequately captures the intercessory role implied by Jesus' use of the term. If I am pressed to translate *Paraclete* into English, I prefer to use the word "Advocate" (John 14:16; 14:26; 15:26; 16:7), which more fully takes into account the way John uses the same word in his first epistle: "But if anyone does sin, we have an *advocate* with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only, but also for the sins of the whole world" (I John 2: 1-2, emphasis mine).

A pair of paracletes What, then, does Jesus teach us in John about the *Paraclete*, our Advocate?

He first teaches us that there are two *paracletes*: "And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another *paraclete*, to be with you forever" (John 14: 16). The Son is our advocate in the sense that He constantly puts before the Father the evidence of His universal atonement for sins (I John 2: 1). The Holy Spirit is another advocate, one who continually seeks to convince us of three important truths: "And when he comes, he will convince the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment" (John 16: 8).

There is a very close relationship between these two *paracletes* in terms of their work within the mystery of the Holy Trinity. Jesus is teaching here about sending the Holy Spirit because He is about to finish His earthly ministry through His death, resurrection and ascension. Once Jesus' earthly work is finished, the Holy Spirit is sent by the Father and the Son to advocate for the Son among humanity by convincing us of our sin, Christ's righteousness and Satan's defeat.

Jesus further explains and emphasizes the importance of this three-fold work of the Holy Spirit: "concerning sin, because they do not believe in me; concerning righteousness, because I go to the Father and you will see me no longer; concerning judgment, because the ruler of this world is judged" (John 16: 9-11). First, the Spirit advocates for the truth that we are sinners who are spiritually dead and blind. Because we do not see our need and cannot come to believe in Jesus on our own due to our dire spiritual condition ("everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin" (John 8: 34), we need the divine help of the Holy Spirit to recognize and confess our sin. Second, He advocates for the truth that Jesus is the righteousness of God whose perfect life and sacrificial death atoned for all sin so that sinners may receive by faith the righteousness they need. Third, He advocates for the truth that Satan, the previous "ruler of the world," has been defeated and judged through Jesus' saving work. (to be continued)
