

### THE ECUMENICAL CREEDS: A BRIEF HISTORY

### THE ATHANASIAN CREED

This Latin creed, originally named "The Catholic Faith" or "The Catholic Faith of Saint Athanasius," consists of 42 clauses, each making a dogmatic claim. The Creed divideds into two parts, the first confessing orthodox Trinitarian dogma against Arius, the second confessing the true incarnation of the Son of God and His two natures. The Creed concludes with statements, similar to the Apostles' Creed, concerning the resurrection of the dead and the final destiny of the good and the evil

This form of the Creed seems to derive from the Spanish bishop, Gregory of Elvira (c. AD 394). However, the earliest witness to "The Catholic Faith" is Caesarius of Arles (c AD 542). The origin of the Creed is southern France, in the area influenced by the great monastery of Lérins. Scholars have mentioned Ambrose (wrong), Vincent of Lérins (perhaps), and Caesarius (most likely) as possible authors of the Creed.

Initially, "The Catholic Faith" was not intended for liturgical use. It was a concise summary of orthodox teaching to guide the preaching and teaching of monks, priests and bishops. For example, a synod at Reims (AD852) under Bishop Hinemar required clergy to memorize the Creed and be able to expound it in the language of the people. Yet in the eighth century the Creed was introduced into psalters and even the Divine Service. By the time of the Reformation it was, along with the Apostles" Creed and the Nicene Creed, regarded as one of the three Ecumenical Creeds.

The trinitatian section opposes two heresies: modalism, which denied the distinction of persons in the Godhead, and Arianism, which denied the true deity of the Son. Both of these are condemned at the very beginning: "We worship one God in Trinity and Trinity in Unity, neither confusing the persons [modalism!] nor dividing the substance [Arianism!]." Against modalism: "The Father's person is one, the Son's another, the Holy Spirit's another"; against Arianism: "The Godhead of the Father, the Son and the Holp Spirit is one, their glory is equal, ther majesty coeternal." Further statements elaborate on the distinction of persons as wll as their essential equal deity.

In the Christological section two heresies are of importance. Apollinaris of Laodicea (c. AD 360) claimed that Jesus had no human soul. This is rejected with the

words: "perfect man subsisting from a rational soul and human flesh." More significant was opposition to Nestorius (c. AD 451). Nestorius distinguished two persons within the unity of Christ. Although rejected at Chalcedon (AD 451), his view remained alive in the West. Against Nestorius: "Who although he is God and man, is nonetheless not two but one Christ." Reflecting Chalcedon: "one not by confusion of substance but by the unity of person."

The creeds thus teach the Christian faith, proclaiming truth and defending against false teaching.
