THE ECUMENICAL CREEDS: A BRIEF HISTORY

THE NICENE CREED

Originally the Nicene Creed Was not a creed to be recited in the liturgy, but a "rule of faith" intended to state the orthodox truth against the heresy of Arius. Hence, in its original form the "rule" begins in the plural: "We believe," referring to the bishops gathered at Nicaea (AD 325). When later the "rule" was confessed in the liturgy and became the creed for Baptism in the East, the singular form, "I believe," became common.

To protect the transcendent and changeless oneness of God against pagan polytheism, Arius claimed that God was "utterly alone, without beginning, alone eternal." What made God to be God was His otherness from all other beings.

The implication, however, was that even the Word of God—Jesus—was not true God, but a creature, born from the will of God. In willing (=creating) His Word, God became Father of the Son (+created Word). Arius erroneously taught that the Jesus of the Gospel stories, therefore, is not God the Son become man, but the created Word become man. As Athanasius observed, if Arius is correct, then Jesus cannot be our savior in the sense of giving us eternal life. For unless Jesus is God incarnate, eternal life is not His to give; otherwise, to be united with Christ is not to be united to the living God.

The formula, or statement, of the Council of Nicaea specifically opposes the Arian heresy. At the end there is a series of "anathemas" condemning certain statements made by Arius, such as: "[theWord] was not before he was begotten" or "he is from a different essence [than that of God the Fataher]" of "the Son of God is created, changeable." The bishops at Nicaea opposed such claims with statements that confess the *unity* of God, the *eternal* distinction between Father and Son, and the *equality in divinity* of Father and Son. "We believe *in one* God, the Father ... and *in one* Lord, Jesus Christ." This *one* God exists in a *distinction of persons*, the Father and the Son. The Father and the Son are each in their personal reality *equally true* God; "The Son of God begotten from the Father as only Son, that is from the essence (=deity) of the Father." So, the Son is "of the same essence with the Father," "true God from true God."

Concerning the Holy Spirit, the council at Nicaea said only, "and in the Holy Spirit." In the face of doubts about the Spirit's deity, the Council of Constantinople (AD 381) added assertions that confess the Spitit's full deity: "Lord," "Giver of Life,"

"proceeds from the Father," "with the Father and Son is worshipped." The addition "proceeds from the Father and from the Son" first appears in AD 589 at the Third Synod of Toledo (Spain). The filioque ("and from the Son") gained allegiance through the West until it was officially added to the Creed in Rome in 1014.

The Nicene Creed was first introduced into the Eucharist by Peter the Fuller, Patriarch of Antioch (AD 476-488). In the West the Creed was introduced at Toledo (AD 589), to be sung before the Lord's Prayer.
