

### EVANGELISM: THIRD ARTICLE WITNESSES, TELLING THE SEC-OND ARTICLE STORY, USING THEIR FIRST ARTICLE GIFTS

"We live on earth only so that we should be a help to other people...that we may bring other people also to faith as He has done for us." This is what Dr. Martin Luther preached in a sermon on I Peter 2 in 1523. Really? Being witnesses of Jesus is our *only* reason for being in the world? Some might argue that Luther was overstating his case to emphasize that witnessing is very important and he didn't actually mean that it is our *only* reason for living in the world. But he went on to say, "Everything then should be directed in such a way that you...make it your highest priority to proclaim this publicly and call everyone to the light to which you are called."

"Only", "everything" and "highest priority." Luther used these words to drive home the point that the Lord strongly desires His children to "be a help to other people" by bringing them the hope and healing that is found only in Jesus. God's people boldly "proclaim the excellencies of Him who called [us] out of darkness into His marvelous light" (I Peter 2: 9) to those who are captive to the darkness of sin and death.

### **OUR HIGHEST PRIORITY?**

Why, if witnessing is so vitally important, do we tend to shy away from speaking about Jesus with the people in our everyday lives? As the influence of the Church has decreased in our society, it's become more difficult to be Christ's witnesses in a world darkened by many kinds of false beliefs. We've lost our influence in our society, we are no longer respected by people in our culture, and we've become preoccupied with other things. Far from our "highest priority," evangelism has taken a distant back seat to myriad other activities in our busy lives. We have let the world tell us that faith is a personal and private matter, not something to be shared in public. Other voices now dominate the public arena and tell us what is good, what is right and what is true. Yet whatever the reasons may be, the end result is the same: Christians have grown silent — even though that silence harms and imperils the very people whom we are called to serve as witnesses of Jesus.

A recent report by the Barna Group summarized the reasons why we do not engage people in spiritual conversations. "People who don't talk very often about faith offer different reasons, but most of these fall into two broad categories: avoidance and ambivalence." In other words, either we are (see page two)

too afraid or we just don't care enough (or both). We are unwilling to risk our friendships, reputations, careers or social status by speaking to the people around us about Jesus.

#### REPRIORITIZING

How do we overcome our "avoidance and ambivalence"? How do we shift our priorities so that proclaiming God's Word to those in spiritual darkness is our first love and "highest priority"? How do we shake off our fears and discover the joy of being Christ's witnesses?

The answer to these questions are found in the same place: who Christ Jesus is and what He's done for us. We confess both of these realities in the Apostles' Creed, and if we look closely, we find that its three articles provide us with a firm foundation for being witnesses of Jesus. 


