

FIRST ARTICLE GIFTS: FULLY EQUIPPED

Telling Jesus' story can be very challenging. We live in a world that is openly hostile to the Gospel, one in which hardened sinners daily resist the grace of Christ. Yet while we may be dismayed by the challenges that confront us, our Lord is not. Through His First Article gifts, He equips us with all that we need to be faithful witnesses where, when and with whom He has placed us.

First Article gifts are the things that God has provide us "to support this body and life." In his explanation of the First Article, Luther states, "He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them." All these things and the other things that Luther lists in his explanation, make up the "everything" that supports our highest priority in life.

HERE AND NOW: TELL HIS STORY

Yes, we live in a time in which the Gospel is despised and rejected. So did Luther. So did St. Paul. So did Jesus. We are, after all, the Church Militant and we live under the cross. But we confess, even so, that the Lord who "has made me and all creatures" — and who loves all that He has made — is a good giver. Above all else, He has given us His only begotten Son for our redemption. He has given us a place in His Second Article story. He gives life to those who hear and receive the Gospel proclaimed by His Third Article witnesses. And, through His First Article gifts, He gives us all that we need to be faithful and effective witnesses to the people He has (or will) put into our lives.

As long as you are here on earth, be of help to your neighbor: Tell His story.
