

HAVE YOU SEEN THE NEW CORPUS YET?



We were able to dedicate it to God's glory at the Retirement Vespers Service on August 6th. It has only been up for a short while, but I thought I would share with you the impact that it already is having on our congregational members.

The impetus for purchasing the corpus was the retirement of Pastor Poppe. He has often commented that he wished there was a corpus on the cross in the front of the sanctuary, but lamented that it wouldn't happen until he died. The day the corpus was installed, he was cleaning out his office in the church. When he stepped into the sanctuary, he was taken aback, and immediately sat down in a pew and was quiet for several minutes. He was speechless, something that doesn't often happen for Pastor Poppe. When finally, he spoke, all he could say was "This is spectacular."

The first Sunday service with the corpus installed was July 30th. That morning, there were many positive comments from our members on its impact. Many stated that it looked like it had always been there. Many commented on how well it matched the front of our sanctuary. But the most common comment was how impactful it was to see a visual depiction of the love of God in our church sanctuary. It brought to many people's minds the words of I John 4, "In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent His only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins," as well as I Corinthians 1: 23, "but we preach Christ crucified."

During the service that morning, as the words of scripture were read, and the sermon was preached, it was nearly impossible to look in any direction other than at the cross. During the distribution of communion, every person was looking at Christ. That morning, during Children's Choir practice, the kids were also impressed. They spent the entire Bible study hour asking questions about the details they noticed, from the depiction of Jesus' scraped knees, to the location of the nails. They asked questions that displayed they already have a tremendous faith and understanding of the sacrifice of Christ. One of the Sunday School kids even went home, and stood on the couch cruciform, telling his parents all about the corpus. We all might remember the words of Hebrews 12, let us look "to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God."

Just a quick reminder to bring things to a close. The corpus is not the object of our worship, Christ is. The corpus is a teaching tool, a visual depiction of what really happened to Jesus so that our sins might be forgiven. We look at the cross now, realizing the depth of our sin, and the price that was paid so that we might have life eternal with God. We do not worship the mere statue, we worship Christ.
