GOD'S CARE AND MIRACLES

A miracle is when God directly intervenes in nature in such a way that the natural order of things is overruled. Something happens that goes beyond nature. For example, Jesus restored sight to a blind man (Mk. 8: 22-26); Elijah brought a young boy back to life (I Ki 17: 17-24). These were genuine miracles.

Yet sometimes we see unusual and wonderful things happen within the natural realm. For example, a horrendous automobile accident may demolish a car, yet the driver walks away with barely a scratch. A tornado turns and misses a building full of people. A plane's landing gear will not operate properly, yet the pilot lands the aircraft safely. A vicious cancer is treated with radiation and chemotherapy and goes into remission. We should be cautious about calling such events miracles in the biblical sense. Even though they are amazing, they are probably different from miracles in that they do not supersede the natural order.

Theologian Norman Geisler gives an example. During the landing of the Allied troops at Normandy, France in World War II, fog rolled in and gave cover for the soldiers. Many lives were saved through this protecting fog. We are thankful to God for providing this unexpected and wonderful gift of protection, but God did this special act of *providential* care through nature. In other words, Jesus walking on water would be a miracle, but soldiers walking through a fog that appeared at just the right time is not a miracle (Norman Geisler, *Miracles and the Modern Mind* [Grand Rapids: Baker Book House, 1992], 124-125).

An example from the book of Exodus may provide further help. In 10:2, the Lord promises to work signs before the people. What follows are various plagues and the crossing of the Red Sea. To prevent the Egyptians from killing the Israelites on the beaches of the Red Sea, the angel of God moves a cloud between the two groups (14: 19-20). To this point, the story about the cloud sounds similar to Geisler's story about the fog at Normandy. However, the next verse tells us that the cloud brought darkness to the Egyptians but light to the Israelites. This is not natural cloud behavior.

If the fog at Normandy had brought darkness to the Nazis but lit up the beaches for the Allies, we would certainly point to the event as a miracle. However, as Geisler describes the Normandy event, it seems like an example of God's providence.

Providence is "that activity of God whereby He uninterruptedly upholds (preserves), governs, and directs" all of life (Lutheran Cyclopedia, ed. Erwin Lueker [St. Louis: Concordia, 1954, 1975] (see page 2)

Providence is God working through the laws of nature on our behalf. Sometimes, He directs the forces of nature so that something unusual and wonderful happens. But a miracle is still something different. In a miracle, God reaches into human life in such a way that natural law is set aside for that moment to accomplish some special and unique purpose.

BUILDING FAITH IN THE HOME






