#### THE GROUND OF ALL TRUTH Truth Today

The fundamental conflict in the world today, then, is not a question of politics, what is the best immigration or tax policy. Rather, the conflicts around social issues that touch on the political, such as marriage, homosexuality and transgenderism, expose the fundamental battle between the truth and the lie. They are not questions of preference or mere tradition.

St. Paul, in the opening argument of Romans, addresses the perversions of men in Roman society "who by their unrighteousness suppress the truth" (Romans 1: 18). The sexual dishonoring of bodies is no mere dalliance against a puritanical prohibition; it spurns the created order, "because they exchanged the truth about God for a lie and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever! Amen." (Romans 1: 25).

Sexual sin is not only the breaking of a commandment but also the rejection of the truth about God. In other words, every part of our experience of this world either reflects or rejects what God has created. He made the world, and either we act in accord with the purpose of that creation, or we struggle against it. The common experience of so many in this life — stress, anxiety, frenzy, chaos — reflects the disorder in creation and our part in it. Like a poorly maintained machine, life slows down, grinds, lurches and finally collapses.

Sex and marriage are some of the primary truths under assault today. In marriage and procreation, man participates in God's ongoing act of creation. Marriage and procreation reflect the relationship between God and His people — or more precisely, between Christ and His church (Eph. 5).

The order God has given in creation, such as in the Sixth Commandment, reflects who God is. Within marriage, husband and wife live in love, self-giving and procreation, reflecting the God who is love and gives of Himself and creates. When man sets aside this commandment, he sets aside the nature of God.

# **People of Truth**

So how can we be people of the Truth in such a depraved society? Our objective cannot be to win an argument or an election, though these have their place. The church is not a debating society but a repenting and forgiving society. Devotion to the Truth means coming to the truth about ourselves, acknowledging the many ways our own lives distort what God meant human life to be. Jesus said that His disciples are to be "of the truth" and sanctified in it. Knowing you are fallen is the starting point to knowing where your end is — from fall to sanctity to maturity. And that end is Christ, the One into whom we are growing (Eph.4).

Assaulted by the lies of the devil, society and within our own selves, we must cling tightly to the One who not only is the Truth but who is true to what He has promised. Before meeting his brother Esau again, Jacob prays: "I am not worthy of the least of all the deeds of steadfast love and all the faithfulness that you have shown to your servant" (Gen. 32: 10).

The New King James Version (NKJV) renders "faithfulness" as "truth." This gives us a window into God's truth. The Hebrew word, which can be translated as "faithfulness" or "truth," has the particular nuance of "firmness." It indicates certainty and support and can even be used for literal pillars, such as the pillars of the temple.

God's Truth is firmly established. We derive "Amen" from the same Hebrew word. "Amen" can also be translated "truly," as when Jesus frequently says, "Truly, truly, I say to you..." The definition in the Small Catechism also helps here: "Yes, yes, it shall be so" (SC. Lord's Prayer). What God says is certain: "O Lord, you are my God; I will exalt you; I will praise your name, for you have done wonderful things, plans formed of old, faithful and sure" (Isaiah 25: 1; NKJV says, "faithfulness and truth").

With such confidence, the Christian knows where Truth is found. He also knows the cost. "Seek the truth," indeed. But have no doubt about where to find it — in the Word of God — or what it cost — the life of Christ. In the Word, the true Light who lightens the world speaks truth that cannot be moved, truth that the devil's lies, which have taken root in our world, cannot overcome. He speaks truth that makes us people of the Truth....


#### **BIRTHDAY WISHES**
