

THE GROUND OF ALL TRUTH What is Truth?

The Christian search for truth begins with revelation. The opening words of the Bible, while not using the word "truth," nevertheless reveal the ground of all truth, something far more concrete and certain than ephemeral experience. "In the beginning, God" (GEN. 1:1). The sentence continues with what God does — create the heavens and the earth. Yet, if we pause for a moment, we have a remarkable statement: In the beginning, God. He exists entirely outside us and our existence. He precedes our beginning, the beginning of the world, the beginning of matter and all our petty squabbles. Before our beginning is the Truth that undergirds every other truth. He is the true One upon whom rests everything true.

The opening of John's Gospel echoes these words from Genesis: "In the beginning was the Word" (JOHN 1: 1). That word is the source of everything made (JOHN 1: 3). He illumines men, that is, shines the truth into their hearts: "In him was life, and the life was the light of men" (JOHN 1: 4). Later John calls Him the "true light" (JOHN 1: 9). At the climax of this beautiful prologue, John says, "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth" (JOHN 1: 14).

Here is John's astonishing argument: Truth is not an idea, information, or a set of propositions or scientific laws. Truth fills this Person, the incarnate Word. Truth resides in the enfleshed God, Jesus, and shines forth. In other words, the Truth is found in Jesus.

Jesus makes truth accessible to us in the words He speaks: "If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free" (JOHN 8: 31-32).

Echoing the divine name Yahweh, often rendered, "I AM," Jesus makes a most audacious claim: "I AM the way, and the truth, and the life" (JOHN 14:6, emphasis added). He does not merely show the way but is the way. He does not merely extend life but is life. So also, He does not just impart truisms; He is the true One. Outside of Him is lies, deceit, distortion.

Standing in opposition to the Truth is the lie. As truth has its source in God, distortions and denials of the truth have their source in the devil. "The devil," Jesus says, "was a murderer from the beginning, and does not stand in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he lies, he speaks out of his own character, for he is a liar and the father of lies" (JOHN 8:44). He spoke lies and half-truths in the Garden of Eden and still speaks these lies today. To counteract the lies of the evil one, Jesus sends the Spirit from the Father. The Spirit is no mere cheerleader at a pep rally, a coach to spur us on to greater achievements. No, Jesus sends the Holy Spirit to bestow His Truth and lead us into Him. "I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever, even the Spirit of truth" (JOHN 14: 16-17; see also 15: 26). The Spirit, then, glorifies Jesus:

When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, for he will take what is mine and declare it to you. (JOHN 16: 13-14)

The Holy Spirit has an integral part to play in delivering the truth to the world. When Jesus prays for His disciples shortly before His arrest, He emphasizes the unity between the Father's Word and Truth: "Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth" (John 17: 17). Jesus later tells Pilate that "everyone who is of the truth listens to my voice" (JOHN 18:37). The truth of Jesus is heard today as the Holy Spirit speaks to the church through God's Word.




Today, we often find lines, divisions, and hate, but we hope to spread a little love and hope. Life is a valuable gift at all ages and all stages of life, and it should be protected.
